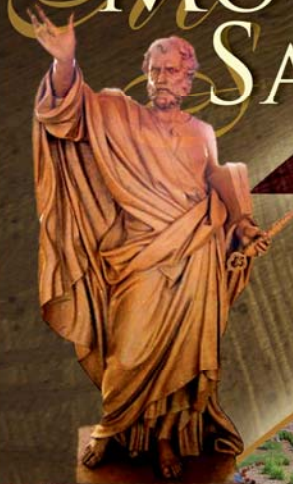

Welcome Sisters of Mary Immaculate!

This weekend, we welcome Sister Ann and Sister Dora who are here as part of the annual Missionary Coop Appeal. The sisters are raising funds to support the work of their religious community in India and Africa.

The Sisters of Mary Immaculate were founded by Bishop Morrow, a zealous missionary and renowned catechetical writer. He was Bishop of Krishnagar, India from 1939 - 1969. In 1984, he founded the Sisters of Mary Immaculate to realize his vision of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ.

In addition to their pastoral and catechetical work in the rural areas of India and Africa, the sisters also staff a personal care home in Leechburg, and provide spiritual support for home schooling families in Western PA.

14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In today's Gospel, Jesus has returned to his hometown. We hear a very familiar Scripture: "A prophet is without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house."

Most of us have taken solace in those words at some time in our lives, especially when we experience rejection. Why do we use that quote? Because it hides the pain! Being a prophet wasn't popular long ago when Ezekiel prophesied. It still isn't. It involves persistence, endurance and pain.

Jesus taught in his hometown synagogue and people took offense. "Where did this man get all this (Mark 6:3)?" In other words, "Who does he think he is?" Regardless of the century, a good prophet knows the consequence of rocking the boat: rejection!

But where would we be without the prophets? Who would invite us to move beyond our own limited vision, who would call us to let go of our own pride and selfish ways, whether in church or in society, if it were not for those annoying prophets? Prophets, like talented and creative people, will rarely be voted employee of the month. But prophecy is the work of the Spirit.

Today, we give thanks for the prophets of old and the prophets of today. May we open our ears to hear the message of Jesus, calling us to conversion of mind, heart, and action.

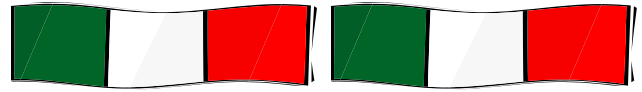

Peace Camp, 2009

Some of our youth and college adults are preparing to participate in Peace Camp 2009. Peace Camp is a summer program developed in response to the increasing violence in our homes, schools, neighborhoods, and world. This program actively engages youth in a variety of activities that teach alternative non-violent ways to respond to conflict. Likewise, Peace Camp provides college adults with the experiences of Christian community living, spiritual reflection and prayer, and training in leadership and non-violent conflict-resolution. After a week of training and prayer, these college adults then lead educational experiences for children, ages 5-12, in non-violent resolutions to conflict in their lives. This is a 2-week experience for the college adults and they earn a \$600-\$800 stipend at the end.



High school counselors are engaged for 2 days of training and then assist the college adults in leading educational experiences for the children, ages 5-12, during the second week. I ask your prayers for these youth in our parish and for all involved in Peace Camp, 2009, Father Ryan Arts Center in McKees Rocks, PA. Let us pray that these youth will be blessed with a rich experience of God's peace in new ways and be given the grace to share that generously, making God's Kingdom here on earth a little bit more like it is in heaven.

United Mornings
