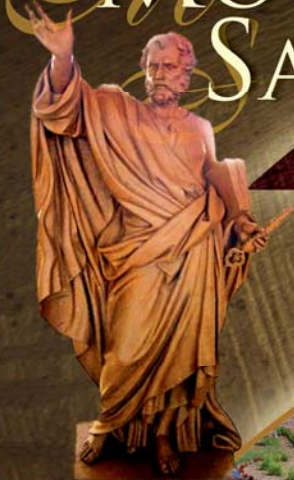

Bethlehem Christian Families

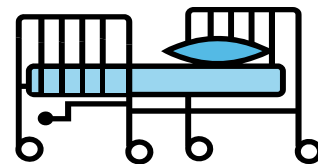

Stewardship Fair

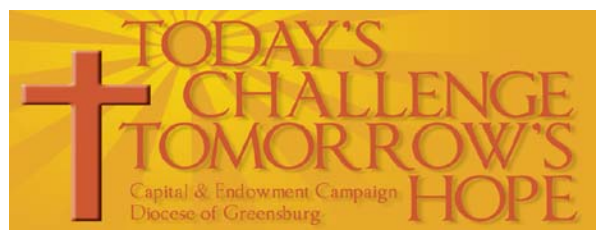
