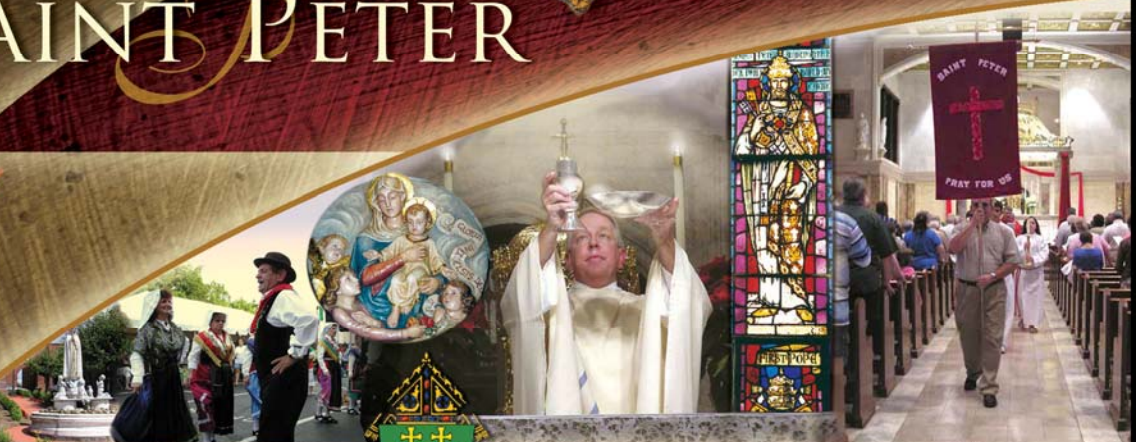
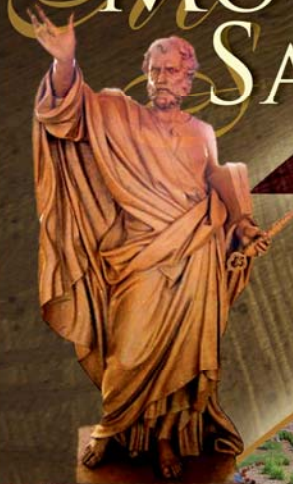

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The primary focus of today's liturgy is the Word of God. Just as the Christmas season was the time to celebrate the incarnation of the Word of God in human form, so today we reflect on the proclamation of the Word of God in the liturgical assembly.

In both the first reading from Nehemiah and the gospel passage from Luke, we see the dynamic power of God's Word as it is proclaimed. Paul's teaching originated as oral proclamation, and like the texts read by Ezra the priest and the one interpreted by Jesus himself, it was first proclaimed aloud. Only later were each of these proclamations regarded as the written Word of God, handed down from one community to another, from one generation to the next. This Word reminds the people of their identity as People of God. It situates them within the long and glorious stream of covenanted people. It calls them to the faithful living out of the implications of their identity.

There is something unique about hearing the Word of God, realizing that it is fulfilled in our hearing. Part of this certainty stems from the oral character of our earliest ancestors. However, there is more to it. In a very real sense, the ear is the threshold through which the Word of God penetrates the consciousness of the person. Thus the fundamental summons of the people of Israel was Hear, O Israel! "Hear" means "take into yourself," allow it to penetrate the deepest resources of your being. Hear the Word of God proclaimed and allow it to take root, like the seed that is sown by the sower.

Both Ezra and Jesus proclaimed the Word of God within the context of a liturgical celebration, a setting similar to the ones wherein most people today hear God's Word proclaimed. According to the teaching of Vatican II, the liturgy is described as the source and summit of our lives, and the Liturgy of the Word is an essential part of that celebration. Like the people of Ezra's time, we are invited to respond: Amen, amen! Thanks be to God!

Winter Ordinary Time

It is not Advent or Christmastime any more. The ninety days of the great Lenten-Easter season have not yet begun. Instead, we find ourselves in between, in the regular sequence of ordinary time on the church calendar.

The word *ordinary* does not mean mundane or commonplace. It simply indicates that the Sundays throughout the year are designated by their ordinal numbers: Second, Third, Fifth, Twenty-sixth, and so on.

Day by Day

It is probably not a bad thing, however, that the word *ordinary* calls to mind everyday concerns and accomplishments. Anyone who thinks that life is all peak experiences and drama has not been paying close attention. A great deal of God's grace is to be found in the day-to-day practice of the faith. During Ordinary Time, daily life sets the pace.

Sunday by Sunday

Ordinary time reminds us that Sunday is the cornerstone of our lives. In the church, it is called "the original feast," because it is the oldest celebration of Jesus that we know. It is a day of joy, a day of resurrection, of rest. It reminds us of the whole of Jesus' life, beginning with the greatest mystery of our faith - Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Every Sunday we celebrate the Lord's Day. We gather in faith, we listen to the stories of Jesus' life, we share the meal of the Eucharist, and we are sent forth to live our faith in the everyday parts of our lives. We are reminded how to be disciples, and nourished for the week ahead so that we might live out the Baptism that claimed us for Christ.

While we may still be putting away the remnants of our Christmas celebration, and already looking at our calendars to see when Easter falls this year, let us enter into this Winter Ordinary Time open to experiencing Jesus in the ordinary rhythms of life. For there is nothing ordinary in any encounter with God.

During Lent, we will be offering an opportunity for parishioners to set aside a little more time for their relationship with Jesus in **Coffee House Faith**. A book will be chosen for all participants to read.



Then, every other week, either some week day after the 8:30AM Mass or some evening we will gather to pray, discuss, and share our faith regarding what we read with one another over one of your favorite coffees (or teas or other beverage).
