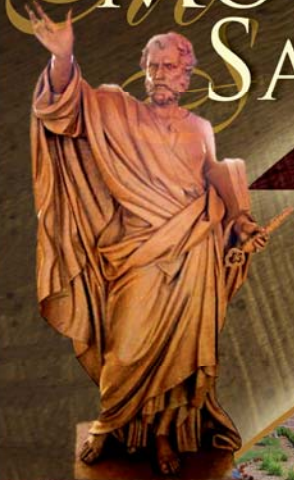

## SOAKING UP SUNDAY

Trinity Sunday marks our return to Ordinary Time. During these "counted weeks" of the year, we continue to celebrate the gift of God's life and love each Sunday. Week after week, God soaks us with a bounty that is both gift and challenge. The bounty of God pours over us, like the waters of baptism and the chrism of Confirmation. It runs over our hearts and minds and bodies, soaking all our activity, our work and our play, our responsibilities and relationships. It is awesome and exhausting and even frightening to have God so near, desperately urging us to be his presence in the world.

Such a deluge demands a weekly Sunday for *rest, worship, hospitality* and *feasting*. Sunday is the day to set aside business as usual and welcome the bounty of God. When commerce buzzes twenty-four/seven, it is difficult to do that. But the baptized life demands no less. Here are some ideas for soaking up Sunday.

**Rest** on Sunday. Get household chores done on Saturday or let them go until Monday. Stay out of the mall, the grocery store, and the movie-theater. Stay focused on the essentials. Clear your schedule, doing only what is necessary so that you can rest and soak up the bounty of God.

**Worship** on Sunday. The foundation of worship is a grateful heart. Give thanks to God with your participation in Sunday Eucharist. Give thanks to God with your participation in the life of your family and friends, by befriending your neighbors and welcoming strangers. Make Sunday a day of thanksgiving by the way you treat others.

**Be hospitable** on Sunday. Welcome the bounty of God by welcoming his creation. Make room and put on your best to welcome whatever and whoever comes your way, most especially those with whom you share a home and everyday life. Do simple things like clean up the house and prepare your Sunday clothes on Saturday. Plan simple meals of household favorites and get the shopping done ahead of time. Put on your best attitude.

**Feast** on Sunday. Feasting in your home may mean an elegant meal with linens, china and crystal. Feasting may mean ordering out and eating off paper plates while enjoying family television time. Feasting may mean dining alone on favorite foods, reminiscing about the fullness of life. It may mean inviting guests in or dining out. From week to week it will likely mean different things. But Sunday feasting should look and feel and taste different from every other day of the week and it should help us be flooded by the goodness of God.

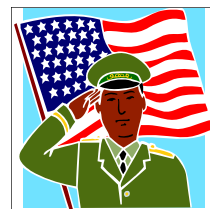
### St. Anthony Novena

### Infant Baptism: Parents and Sponsors

*Parents are assisted in their preparation and in raising their child in the faith by godparents. During the Rite of Baptism, godparents promise to help the parents in their duty as Christian parents. Because of this special relationship, parents should consider seriously the persons they ask to be godparents, remembering that their primary role is in relationship to the parents. Godparents should be chosen because they are willing and able to assist in the faith formation of the child, not simply because of familial or social relationship. (MSP Baptism Guidelines)*

Just as parents investigate schools or athletic programs or any other organized activity for their children, making sure that those who will be "teaching" their children are adequately qualified, so too, parents need to search carefully for those persons whom they believe to be adequately qualified to help them in the faith formation of their child. Just as any teacher or coach needs to receive adequate education and/or training before assuming their role, likewise the godparents need to be adequately prepared to assume their role. That is why a godparent needs to be an:

- active, regularly participating member of a Catholic parish
- a fully initiated Roman Catholic (having received Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist)
- at least 16 years of age
- in good standing with the Church and, if married, having done so in the Catholic Church.

Their preparation is no less important, in fact more important, than what you would expect of any adult whom you place in a mentoring, coaching or teaching role with your child.

Please contact Sister Valerie 4 months prior to the expected birth of your child to learn of the needed preparations for the Baptism of your child.

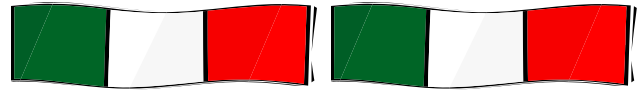
**Graduation Mass and Brunch**
