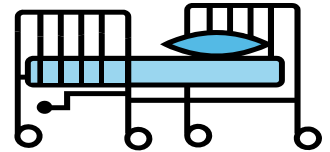
St. Anthony Novena

Pastoral Ministry

To visit the sick is a
corporal work of mercy. In
our desire to visit our
parishioners in the hospital,
in a care facility or at home, we are asking that
family members call to let us know where the patient
may be. When a person is transferred from the
hospital to a nursing care facility, even if it is
temporary, we ask that we be contacted so we may
continue to see them. We wish to provide
opportunities for the reception of the sacraments,
anointing of the sick, Eucharist and Reconciliation.



It is also important to keep our senior members
connected to the parish they love when they are
homebound and no longer able to come to church.
The comfort of pastoral care and the presence of the
church are important in the lives of our people as
they encounter the challenges of the aging process.

WHY PEACE CAMP?

- 89% of the top-selling video games contain some kind of *violence*
- 61% of television programs contain some form of *violence*
- About 1 in 3 high school students say they have been in physical fights in the past year and about 1 in 8 of those required medical attention for their injuries
- More than 1 in 6 students in Grades 6-10 say they are bullied.

And research continues to reveal evidence that media *violence* increases the likelihood of aggressive and violent behavior.

Some would argue that fighting and *violence* have always been a part of life - and especially of growing up; so what's the big deal. One of the "big deals" is that our youth now have more access to different kinds of violent behavior and, of course, to weapons. And the news is unfortunately filled with incidents of youth using these weapons in various confrontations. Your son or daughter may not be or become a perpetrator; however, all of us are vulnerable to being innocent victims of *violence*.

Peace Camp, first, attempts to offer our children ways of working with their own internal anger, frustration, disappointment, and hurt. Second, Peace Camp attempts to offer to our children alternative ways of meeting and interacting with others' violent behaviors. These alternative ways seek

- *to build relationships, not fracture them,*
- *to prevent hurt (physical and otherwise), not cause it*
- *to change threatening behaviors into viable relationships, instead of violent confrontations.*

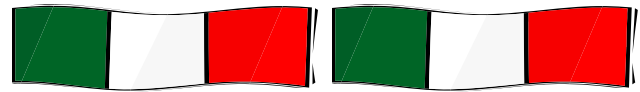
