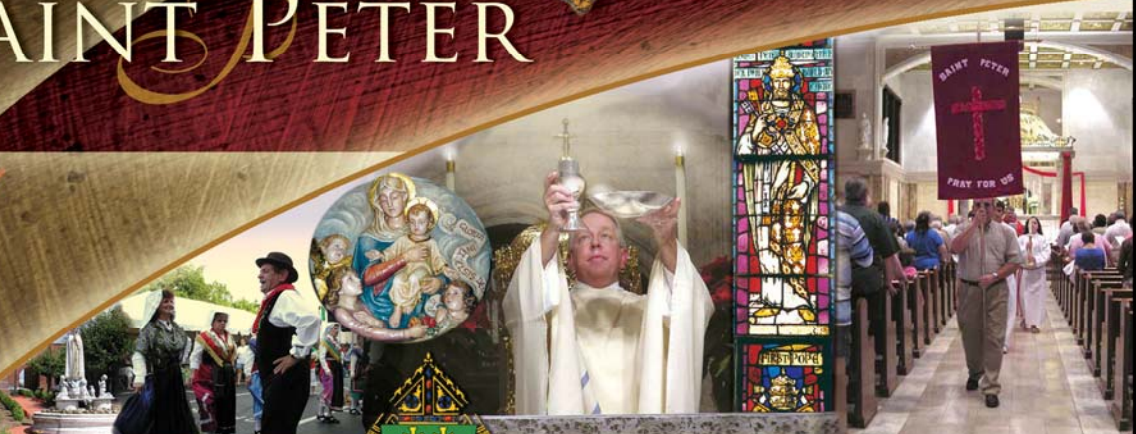
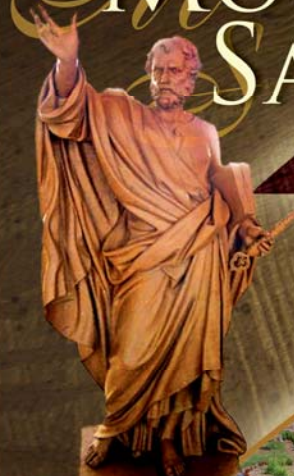

Interesting Characters

There are many interesting characters in today's liturgy: King David, Paul the Pharisee, Simon the Pharisee, the unnamed woman who greets Jesus in Simon's house - all viewed through the lens of their perceptions of their righteousness.

In biblical terms, to be righteous meant to be in the right relationship with God, a concept measured by fidelity to the Law. Both David and the woman in the Gospel recognized their lack of righteousness and acknowledged it. There was no defense, no pretense of being what they were not. They epitomized the words of the psalmist: *"I acknowledge my sin to You, my guilt I covered not. I said, 'I confess my faults to the Lord' and You took away the guilt of my sin."*

Such an acknowledgement was far from Simon's mind. The Pharisees were a sect within Judaism who promoted adherence to the Law. In their strict adherence to the letter of the Law, they sometimes lost sight of other equally important aspects of the Covenant, for example, God's mercy.

In the Gospel, Simon shows his self-righteousness. He makes it evident that he, not the woman, is worthy of association with God's prophet. What is more, Simon scorns Jesus for not recognizing this. From Simon's perspective, Jesus was "defiled" by her sinfulness. Simon thinks less of Jesus because of this.

Simon has missed the point. Jesus welcomes sinners that he might bring them the reality of God's love and forgiveness. The woman, recognizing her great need, was able to receive what Jesus offered. Simon was not.

In recognizing God's many gifts to us, especially the gift of God's mercy and forgiveness, may we be strengthened to be instruments of God's peace and mercy to others.

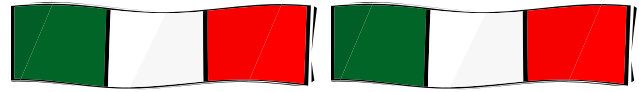
United Mornings Hot Breakfast Program
