

Trier, Germany

The Trier Cathedral (326 AD) is, Germany's oldest Cathedral and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. For pilgrims to Trier, the cathedral's central attraction is the **Holy Robe**, the tunic of Christ. The relic is enshrined in a reliquary housed in the specially-built baroque chapel, located behind the altar. Another important relic is the **Holy Nail**, believed to be one of those used in the Crucifixion; it is on display in the Cathedral Treasury Museum.

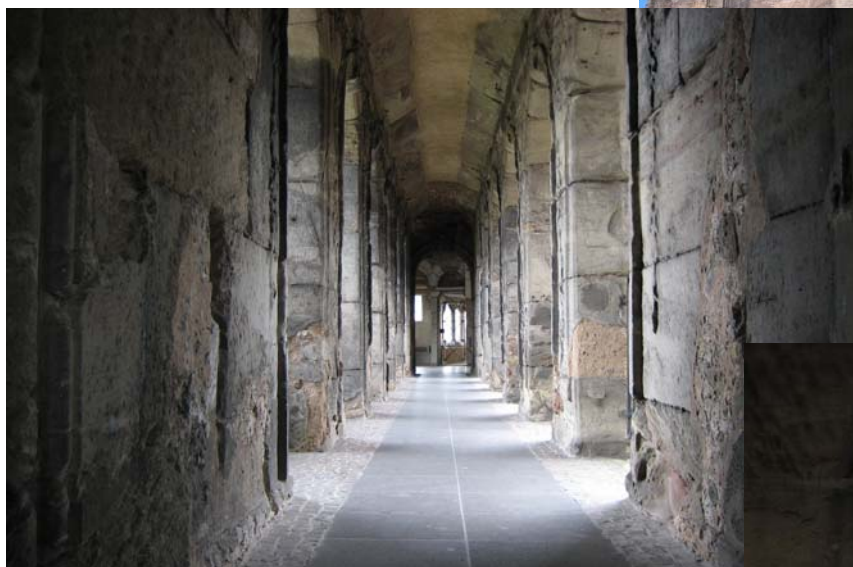
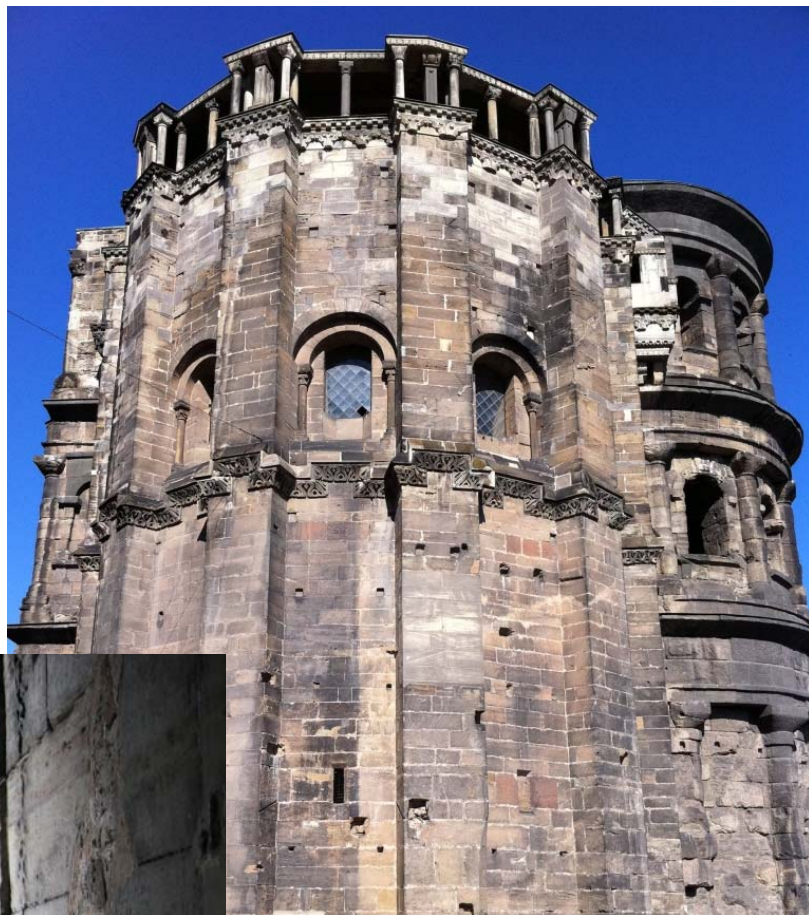
